Village Board Meeting

Village of Waddington June 4, 2018

A regular meeting of the Village Board of Waddington, County of St. Lawrence, and State of New York was held on Monday June 4, 2018 at 6:00pm in the Municipal Building, 48 Maple Street.

The last 3 docks at the boat ramp are not in yet, they are waiting for floats.

Moore museum is being cleaned up

SLC historical Society would like access to the Moore Museum, this will be granted when the Museum is cleaned and organized

Brian Mott will be installing a new furnace in the Moore Museum after the toilet and mop sink are fixed and installed.

Chris did a walk about with the Village Insurance Company for an evaluation of all the Village owned Buildings.

The Village got their new pickup truck, they will get an estimate on a plow. Also, will be getting a bar light and signs for the new truck.

Putney's did the leaf and brush pick up. Village followed up with their own pickup for residents that put their leaf bags out later.

Chris said he would like to setup the Clam Shell to make sure everything is good in case the Village has an opportunity to rent it out.

Mayor Otto-Cassada and Chris thanked the board for letting them hire a 3rd fulltime employee and summer help. This greatly helps to keep up with demand

Citizens Comment:

Lorry bass commented on the fox problem in the Village of Waddington. She was told to contact the Towns' animal control officer or DEC

Patty VanPatten Was inquiring about hanging plants for the Village. Chris said they have been purchased. Patty also asked about Steel sculptures for the walkway along the river walkway. Mayor Otto-Cassada will ask the New York Power Authority if this can be done.

Mark Scott asked about the kiosk at Island View park and what we can do to get some business information in it. A list of businesses will be compiled to put in the Kiosk.

Old Business:

Mayor Otto-Cassada asked about the wind resistant study for the new playground equipment for Island View park. This study was done and given to NYPA. The Village is now waiting NYPA's engineers to look it over and let us know if the Village will be getting the playground.

Trustee O'Bryan asked about the Contracts for Island View Park and the Arena. He would like to know if residents Certificate of Liability could be five hundred thousand and Commercial be one million.

The Village will have our Attorney look at the contracts to make that decision.

New Business:

Need to have Reserved signs made for Island View Park Pavilion

The boat mooring sites will be checked on during the summer to make sure that there are docks at each site. If there are no docks on the sites, there will be noncompliance letters sent to these people and they will not be able to have the mooring site in the future. This is according to #16 on the mooring site contract.

The Village will check with NYPA about possibly getting additional mooring sites.

Trustee Fairchild made a motion to create additional mooring sites on the Village owned property on James Street, this was 2nd by Trustee O'Bryan.

Mayor Otto-Cassada would like to know if the Board of Trustees would be in favor of giving the Waddington Rescue Squad a donation. The board agreed and said the Village would put it as a line item on the next budget.
