Village Board Meeting

March 2, 2020

A regular meeting of the Village Board of Waddington, County of St. Lawrence, and State of New York was held on Monday March 2, 2020 at 6:00pm in the Municipal Building, 48 Maple Street

The Public hearing for Local Law 1 2020 was called to order by Mayor Zagrobelny at 5:50pm
The Local Law 1 2020 increased members of the Zoning and Planning Committees from 3 to 5 with staggered terms

A motion was made by Trustee Thew and 2nd by Trustee Martin to close the Public Hearing

Julie McBath spoke about defibrillators and the importance of having them in public places, like Island View Park Pavilion and the Donald Martin Civic Center

There is possible Grant money for the purchase of the Defibrillators

Mayor Zagrobelny will check with NYCOM about the cost

Julie also said that the Rescue Squad has 2 members that are certified trainers for CPR

Julie recommended that all Municipal employees take the CPR course

Heather Mathis asked about the Villages plans for replacing street lighting to LED bulbs and who was our representative from National Grid. Miss Mathis gave the Village a contact name and phone number for National Grid and a suggestion for what bulbs to use.

DPW:

The Sweeper was ordered, it will be picked up and delivered by the Village DPW.
The Town Highway Department and the Village DPW would like to buy a Tamper as a shared piece of equipment. The cost to each would be \$1000.
There will be a few items put on the Auctions International website soon
There was one water main break in February
Snow removal
Bobcat was fixed

Reports:

Town of Waddington:

Supervisor Hammond reported that the USDA Grant was approved for a new Plow Truck
During the annual meeting with NYPA different projects for the Town were discussed

Recreation:

NYPA is going to replace 2 dugouts at Whitaker Park
Baseball signups are March 7, 2020 at the Civic Center
The Madrid and Waddington summer recreation programs will be working together for the baseball program
Mayor Zagrobelny said that there will be discussion to add monies to the Recreation budget for the summer recreation program
The ice at the Civic Center is done for the season
Russ Strait said that if anyone wanted to donate any used skates to the arena, he would accept them

Code Enforcement:

Anthony McManaman met with Roll Lock Truss to discuss an addition to their building

Moore Museum

President of the Museum Board, James Miller reported that they did cleaning at the Museum. The committee is trying to get two rooms ready for a June opening
They are still in the process of hiring a Museum Director
The next meeting for the Museum Board is March 7, 2020
Mayor Zagrobelny met with a representative at Community bank about the Museum CD. The Bank will be sending paperwork to the main branch in hopes of getting answers about the CD.
The sewer has to be dug up in the spring
Discussion about the salary for Museum director was had

Fire Department

The Fire Department banquet was Saturday February 29, 2020 and they will be electing officers at Tuesday's meeting
The Waddington Fire Department and Rescue Squad are recruiting new members
Mayor Zagrobelny and Trustee Martin will meet with the Fire Department to go over budget concerns

Old Business:

The Civic Center Agreement was presented by Trustee Thew, discussion ensued

A motion was made by Trustee Hough and seconded by Trustee Martin to accept the new Civic Center Contract with the discussed revisions

Trustee Fairchild presented plans for the Civic Center upgrades

Plan A dealt with exterior upgrades and Plan B dealt with interior upgrades

Discussion ensued and Plan B was accepted as the go ahead plan for Grants that the Village has received.

Trustee Fairchild will contact the Architect and get bids for next month's meeting.

Discussion ensued about putting turf in the Civic Center and eliminating ice.

Supervisor Hammond asked if the Town should be involved in that decision due to joint recreation with the Town and Village

Mayor Zagrobelny said that the Village owns the Civic Center so it would be their decision to make, but would take into consideration the concerns and comments of the Town and Joint Recreation board

Trustee Thew went over the survey that was done in 2006 asking the residents of Waddington what they would like happen in the Civic Center

The Village of Waddington was denied the WIIA Grant, the engineers that the Village are working with will look into the reason and get back to us.

DEC is concerned about the Dock Project at the end of Main Street. This is part of the REDI Grant the Village of Waddington will receive

New Business:

A motion was made by Trustee Thew and seconded by Trustee Fairchild to accept the changes to Local Law 1 2020. Increasing the number of members of the Zoning and Planning Board from 3 to 5 members

A motion was made by Trustee Fairchild and seconded by Trustee Hough to sign a St. Lawrence County Hold Harmless Resolution for shared service through St. Lawrence County
